Framework Programme 7: *Per Capita* Statistics for 2007-2013

This briefing note is provided in response to a request for further information on European Union (EU) competitive funding in Northern Ireland. It supplements RalSe briefing NIAR 795-13 for the Committee for the Office of the First and deputy First Minister.

Introduction

This briefing note is provided in response to a request for further information on European Union (EU) competitive funding in Northern Ireland. The note refers specifically to the Framework 7 Programme (FP7) statistics provided in section 7.2 of RalSe paper NIAR 795-13, dated 27 November 2013. The Committee for the Office of the First and deputy First Minister has requested a *per capita* breakdown of the FP7 figures for England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland.

1. FP7 Per Capita Statistics

The information in the following table is taken from the FP7 eCorda database¹ (provided by the UK Government Department for Business Innovation and Skills) and the *Tenth Interim Report of Irish Involvement in the Seventh European Union Framework Programme* (supplied by Enterprise Ireland). The figures were released on 1 July 2013. As previously discussed in RalSe paper NIAR 795-13, at sub-section 6.1, these figures do not equate to 'drawdown' as defined by the Northern Ireland Executive.

The table below calculates the *per capita* EC requested financial contributions:

The most current population figures available are taken from 2012. The estimated usual resident population of the United Kingdom in mid-2012 was 63,705,000.³ This was comprised of the following:

- 53,493,700 in England;
- 5,313,600 in Scotland;

- 3,074,100 in Wales; and,
- 1,823,600 in Northern Ireland.

The estimated population of the Republic of Ireland in April 2012 was 4,585,400.4
