Key Points

Eleven MLAs indicated their intention to retire, were deselected or declared they would not contest the election:

- Alex Maskey
- · Chris Lyttle
- Emma Rogan
- George Robinson
- Jim Wells
- Paul Rankin
- Paula Bradley
- Robin Newton
- Sinéad Bradley
- Trevor Lunn
- William Humphrey

Among these was Alex Maskey who announced his intention to retire in August 2021. George Robinson also declared his intention to retire while Robin Newton was deselected.

Nine assembly Members failed to secure enough votes to be elected to the assembly:

- Clare Bailey
- Dolores Kelly
- Mervyn Storey
- Nichola Mallon
- Pat Catney
- Peter Weir
- · Rachel Woods
- Rosemary Barton
- Roy Beggs

Most of these MLAs were replaced by new Alliance Party of Northern Ireland MLAs and one was displaced by another candidate in their own party. There are 20 new assembly Members.

Executive Summary

Prior to the election a number of MLAs were deselected or indicated their intention to retire including: Chris Lyttle (stepped down), Emma Rogan (deselected), George Robinson (retired), Jim Wells (deselected), Paul Rankin (co-opted temporarily), Paula Bradley (stepped down), Robin Newton (deselected), Sinéad Bradley (stepped down), Trevor Lunn (left party and stepped down), William Humphrey (stepped down) and Alex Maskey (retired). Several MLAs were not elected including: Clare Bailey, Dolores Kelly, Mervyn Storey, Nichola Mallon, Pat Catney, Peter Weir, Rachel Woods, Rosemary Barton and Roy Beggs. A summary table is included (page 7).

20 new Assembly MLAs were elected: Danny Baker, Peter McReynolds, Kate Nicholl, Eóin Tennyson, Cathy Mason, Alan Robinson, Diane Forsythe, Patricia O'Lynn, Nuala McAllister, David Honeyford, Jeffrey Donaldson (to be co-opted by Emma Little-Pengelly), Philip Brett, Nick Mathison, Connie Egan, David Brooks, Tom Elliot, Danny Donnelly, Patrick Brown, Sorcha Eastwood and Brian Kingston.

Alex Maskey, a Sinn Féin (SF) MLA for Belfast West was elected speaker in 2020 and currently holds this role pending developments. Alex Maskey announced his retirement in August 2021¹. Danny Baker is a new MLA for

Belfast West. Danny Baker (SF) was co-opted onto Belfast City Council in 2017 and became Lord Mayor 2019.

Chris Lyttle, an Alliance Party of Northern Ireland (APNI) MLA for Belfast East announced he would stand down in October 2021². A new MLA, Peter McReynolds (APNI), replaces Chris Lyttle.

Emma Rogan, a SF MLA for South Down, was co-opted to join the Assembly in 2017 to represent South Down but was deselected in May 2021 and replaced by a new MLA, Cathy Mason (SF).

George Robinson, a Democratic Unionist Party (DUP) assembly MLA for East Londonderry, retired in March 2022. George Robinson represented the constituency at the Assembly since 2003. He was replaced by a new MLA, Alan Robinson (DUP).

Jim Wells, a DUP MLA for South Down since 1998, was deselected in January 2022 and resigned from the DUP in April. The seat is now held by a new DUP MLA, Diane Forsythe.

Paul Rankin, a DUP MLA for Lagan Valley, did not stand for election. Paul Rankin was co-opted to be MLA for Lagan Valley to replace Edwin Poots (DUP)³. Edwin Poots transferred to Belfast South to replace Christopher Stalford. Jeffrey Donaldson (DUP) was elected as an MLA for Lagan Valley but said he would remain an MP until the Northern Ireland Protocol was resolved leaving the Lagan Valley seat to be co-opted by Emma Little Pengelly (DUP)⁴.

Paula Bradley, a DUP MLA for Belfast North and deputy leader of the DUP did not seek re-election⁵ and has been replaced by a new DUP MLA, Philip Brett.

Robin Newton, a DUP MLA for Belfast East since 2003, was deselected in February 2022 and replaced on the DUP ticket by local councillor David Brookes who was subsequently elected as an MLA for Belfast East.

Sinéad Bradley of the Social Democratic and Labour Party (SDLP) and MLA for South Down stood down in May 2021. The SDLP lost ground to APNI in the election leaving Colin McGrath as the only assembly MLA for the party in the South Down constituency. Patrick Brown (APNI) is a new MLA for South Down.

Trevor Lunn, an APNI MLA for Lagan Valley, left APNI in 2020 and remained in post as an independent without plans to contest the upcoming election ⁶. APNI gained ground in Lagan Valley with two new MLAs, David Honeyford and Sorcha Eastwood being elected replacing both Pat Catney (SDLP) and Trevor Lunn.

William Humphrey, a DUP MLA for North Belfast, announced he would be stepping down after more than a decade at the Assembly⁷ and stated that he would not contest the election⁸. William Humphrey has been replaced by a new MLA, Brian Kingston (DUP).

Clare Bailey, former Green Party (GP) MLA for Belfast South, will not be returning and has been replaced by a new MLA, Kate Nicholl (APNI). Kate Nicholl served as Belfast Lord Mayor from June 2021 until her election as an MLA in 2022⁹.

Dolores Kelly, former SDLP MLA for Upper Bann has been replaced by Eóin Tennyson (APNI).

Mervyn Storey (DUP) who has held his seat in North Antrim since 2003 has also been replaced, with Patricia O'Lynn (APNI) securing the votes to become a new MLA for North Antrim.

Nichola Mallon, former SDLP assembly Member for Belfast North, was replaced by new MLA, Nuala McAllister (APNI).

Pat Catney, former SDLP MLA for Lagan Valley, was replaced by a new MLA, David Honeyford (APNI).

Peter Weir, a DUP MLA for Strangford (and previously North Down)¹⁰ has been replaced by a new MLA, Nick Mathison (APNI).

Rachel Woods, former GP MLA for North Down, was replaced by a new MLA, Connie Egan (APNI).

Rosemary Barton, former UUP MLA for Fermanagh and South Tyrone was displaced by another UUP candidate, Tom Elliot who was an MLA for the constituency from 2003 to 2015 before becoming an MP from 2015 to 2017.

Finally, Roy Beggs, a former long serving UUP MLA for East, has been replaced by new a new MLA, Danny Donnelly (APNI).
