Firstly let it be noted that 'Everyone's right to life shall be protected ' (Article 2 of The Human Rights Act), except it seems when that life is not yet born and from Northern Ireland, where abortion has been forced on the people of Northern Ireland without their consent. On the contrary small assemblies such as these are peaceful vigils where pregnant, vulnerable women are talked to with love and compassion, not harassment. They are given information that would otherwise not be provided once they enter these abortion facilities. They are offered alternatives and practical help whereby the life of the mother as well as her baby is valued. They and their unborn babies are prayed for too. Is praying, distributing leaflets and showing care now to become a crime. Seriously?
