I am writing to you with reference to the upcoming bill relating to the ongoing protests outside establishments offering abortion services.

Our democratic right is the 'right to protest' and certainly to protest for such a just and worthy cause, that being the preservation of life of the unborn child. I can appreciate that some of the images presented are disturbing (and I personally do not agree with these images being displayed publicly), however unfortunately, this is the grave reality of abortion. Innocent, vulnerable babies are being wilfully destroyed and it is being sanitized as 'legitimate healthcare for women'.

The recent abortion law that was imposed on us by a Westminster government did not have the support of the people of Northern Ireland, and yet here we are, being told by our elected representatives that we are not even permitted to protest against it.
