LEGISLATIVE CONSENT MOTIONS COMMITTEE INQUIRY

At its meeting on 1 December 2021, the Committee on Procedures received a briefing from the Assembly's Research and Information Service (RalSe) in relation to a query it had raised relating to the number of recent LCMs and adherence to the NI Assembly Legislative Consent Motion procedures.

This additional research was commissioned as part of the Committee's ongoing Inquiry into LCMs. Information was sought to primarily establish, (i) the number of Bills since January 2020 which have been introduced to Parliament and which require(d) the consent of the Northern Ireland Assembly, and (ii) of these, on how many occasions Ministers have laid a memorandum (either in line with the requirements of Standing Order 42A(4) or not). In addition, the Committee also sought information on (iii) how much time there was between the date of the Bills' introduction and the date of the final amending stage in the House of Commons.

During the discussion, the Committee agreed that it was minded to explore, as part of its ongoing Inquiry, whether there may be scope to incorporate additional time, where possible, into the parameters of the existing Standing Order 42A to afford committees further time to carry out their scrutiny on the relevant devolution matter.

Furthermore, the Committee noted from the research briefing, that there have been a number of occasions where Ministers have not acted in accordance with the requirements of Standing Order

42A(4), either by laying a legislative consent memorandum before the Assembly outside the normal 10 working days prescribed or even, in some cases, laying no memorandum at all.

Therefore, the Committee agreed that I write a final time to the Executive on this matter and to:

I. draw your attention to the research paper and in particular to the table in Annex A

II. bring to your attention the fact that the Committee is likely to make comment on the issues

raised in this paper in its inquiry report, and

III. ask again whether the Executive wishes to respond to the inquiry ToRs or comment on the

issues raised in the research report and the RalSe briefing, prior to the Committee

reporting.
