5. Oral Evidence Session: DAERA – Climate Change Bill

The officials briefed the Committee and this was followed by a question and answer session.

6. Departmental Written Briefing: Consultation on amendments to the Marine Licensing (Exempted Activities) Order (Northern Ireland) 2011

The Committee considered the departmental written briefing on the proposed consultation on amendments to the Marine Licensing (Exempted Activities) Order (Northern Ireland) 2011 which will launch on 28 May 2021 for a period of 9 weeks. The amendments will ensure that the marine licensing system remains proportionate to the risk to the environment, human health and other uses of the seas to ensure an operation that is efficient and coherent and consistent with marine licensing across Northern Ireland waters and the wider UK.



Agreed: The Committee agreed to write to the Department to request an analysis of the consultation responses in due course.

Agreed: The Committee agreed to forward questions for inclusion in the correspondence to Mrs Donaghy to the Clerk by close of play on 28 May 2021, which will be circulated to the Committee prior to issue.

Agreed: The Committee agreed to publish a redacted version of received email correspondence from Alderman Mulvenna with the elements not directly related to the Committee's Inquiry removed as per legal advice. Alderman Mulvenna will be notified of this and Committee's intention to also send Mrs Donaghy a reacted copy of the email.

Noted: The Committee noted the correspondence which had been received by a Committee Member regarding the Farm Nutrient Management Scheme. Members



noted that Legal Services will draft a reply on behalf of the Members concerned. It was noted that another Committee Member had received similar correspondence and had taken independent legal advice.
