COMMON FRAMEWORKS PROGRAMME

At its meeting on 19 January 2022, the Committee for the Executive Office considered correspondence from the Northern Ireland Assembly EU Affairs Manager in relation to the current status of the Common Frameworks programme.

The UK Government and devolved administrations have agreed to aim to complete delivery of the Common Frameworks programme in March 2022, ahead of the pre-election period for the 2022 Northern Ireland Assembly elections. You may be aware there are 32 Common Frameworks relating to Northern Ireland, 18 of which are still to be provided to the relevant Assembly Committees for scrutiny.

There are 6 Common Frameworks to be considered by the Committee for Economy which can be seen below:

This information will be collated and sent to the Executive Office and the House of Lords Common Frameworks Committee to ensure that the relevant feedback from the Northern Ireland Assembly Statutory Committees is fed into the overall Common Frameworks process.

Given that the proposed deadline for completion of all Frameworks is March 2022 I would appreciate a response at your earliest convenience.
