Consultation on Presumed consent Organ Donation

I would like to express my concern and opposition to any attempt by government to assume consent to those who have not agreed to organ donation at their death. The human body is not the property of the state but of God who created it and sustains it while life lasts. The wishes of family members to honour the bodies of their nearest and dearest at death is also a recognized human right since time began and among all cultures. While many people who have considered this matter have decided to donate organs, the state must respect that others have not so consented and that some have personal and conscientious objections or reservations . Furthermore , family members should not be put under any pressure or find themselves with no say in the case of a sudden death of a relative where the deceased has not made a decision to donate . In such cases, the state should seek , obtain and respect the wishes of remaining family members. To do otherwise introduces a very dangerous precedent in connection with individual rights and liberties.

At one point church services were even disallowed in parts of the UK until this was rightly challenged and overturned . The presumed right proposed legislation sets a very dangerous precedent and as such I would ask those in government not to introduce this new legislation but to keep the "opt in" arrangements as they are
