speak to their membership and to provide the Committee with information on issues arising in respect of workers' rights in Dublin Port due to delays in processing shipments and information in respect of what measures can be put in place now to mitigate against such situations arising on 1 April and 1 July in Northern Ireland ports if no easements are agreed with the UK Government.
