COMMITTEE INQUIRY INTO PRIVATE MEMBERS' BILL (PMBS)

Thank you for your correspondence dated 17 December 2021 regarding an Inquiry into the current procedures and support for Private Members' Bills offered by the Assembly and for the opportunity to offer comment.

I wish to make the following points as a Minister, having observed the Private Members Bills process from both inside and outside the Executive. These should be taken alongside those made in the Alliance Party submission to this Inquiry.

- Thought should be given as to how Departments and individual MLAs might be able to work together on PMBs where a Minister is in favour of the intent of a proposed Bill, but does not have a legislative vehicle or adequate time to draft provisions themselves;
- Training should be given to MLAs at the start of each mandate on the key differences between primary and secondary legislation. Whilst this issue extends beyond PMBs and into the wider Assembly and Executive legislative processes, it would benefit members to understand the appropriate level at which the changes

they are seeking should be achieved and would facilitate consistency of approach across Executive and Assembly business.
