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Learning Disability Support Locations in Northern Ireland

1 Introduction

The following paper provides information on the locations of support for people with learning disabilities in Northern Ireland.

Included within this paper is a map of support, broken down into the following categories:

- Day time activities for adults with a learning disability;
- Domiciliary Care;
- Employment and Skills;
- Learning disability assessment and treatment for children;
- Learning disability hospital, assessment and treatment;
- Residential Care;
- Respite Services; and
- Supported Living.

- Information sources are drawn from a number of locations, including organisation websites, information published by Health and Social Care Trusts and Regulation and Quality Improvement Authority (RQIA) reports. As such, the maps and table should not be considered a definitive source of information on learning disability support providers in Northern Ireland and should be used for indicative purposes only;
- The maps provide information on location and main function of support providers;
- The maps provide locations based on the main identified function of an organisation in order to ensure ease of reading. A number of support providers carry out multiple functions and this information is provided in Appendix 1.

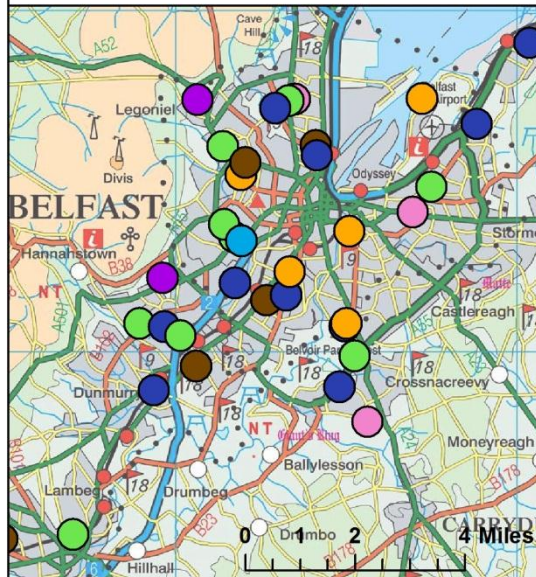
