To ask the Minister for Employment and Learning how many counsellors have been trained by each university, in the last 5 years.

ANSWER

As the Department does not hold the information requested, my officials contacted Queen's University, the University of Ulster and the Open University. The universities have indicated that a total of 902 students have completed counselling courses in the last 5 years.

Details of the universities responses are attached at Annex A.

The University of Ulster

The Diploma of Higher Education in Counselling was approved in 2004 and admitted its first intake of students in September of that year. It was designed to fill an identified gap in education provision namely a scarcity of Counsellor "pre registration" training in Northern Ireland. This gap was identified in the Government's review into Counselling Services which reported in 2002 (DHSSPS Counselling in Northern Ireland Report of the Counselling Review). This review had recommended that there should be a rationalisation of courses for Counselling Students and that there should be a rationalisation of the existing range of course titles which were at that stage confusing. This was revalidated as a Foundation degree in March 2009.

The FdSc in Counselling was designed to meet the needs for professional training of people who are involved in counselling roles in a number of distinct professional contexts. It provides students with an opportunity to develop theoretical knowledge in counselling together with practical skills appropriate to their role. This programme provides a flexible yet coherent framework that enables students to exit at a level commensurate with their work roles. At the highest level it provides students with a programme that meets the educational requirements of the British Association for Counselling and Psychotherapy (BACP). This is the only professional counselling 'training' programme based on supervised practice experience.

While there is an increase in the number of individuals wishing to become professionally accredited as counsellors, it should be noted that the majority of applicants to counselling courses do not envisage their professional careers developing along a purely counselling route. Rather, they would wish to develop the counselling aspect of their current role. The Certificate, UG and PG programmes offer academic knowledge and counselling skills development.

The Certificate and FdSc Degree is offered in collaboration with key counselling staff in all the Northern Ireland Regional Colleges. The Counselling Education and Training Partnership is an informal collaborative network with Counselling teams in: Belfast Metropolitan College (Gerald Moag Campus), Northern Regional College (Ballymena Campus), North West Regional College Derry and Limavady campus), South East Regional College (Lisburn campus), Southern Regional College (Banbridge and Newry campus) and South West College (Omagh campus). The Partnership works on a basis of mutual cooperation and respect with each member playing in equal role in decision making and course management.

Both the British and Irish Associations for Counselling and Psychotherapy require that counselling training programmes are built around a core theoretical model in order to ensure that students are exposed to a sufficient depth of knowledge and skills training. The professional ethos of the University of Ulster FdSc in Counselling is to encourage the students to develop a 'Humanistic Integrative' approach to counselling practice, providing a framework of practice that incorporates key theoretical principles and practice from Humanistic, Cognitive and Behavioural theories with consideration being given to the Psychodynamic approach, in keeping with current professional standards.

The Open University

The Open University Foundation Degree in Counselling does not result in accreditation to practice as a counsellor. Students have to undertake at least 150 hours' supervised practice and then apply for individual accreditation to the British Association for Counselling and Psychotherapy (BACP).

No students have completed the Open University Foundation Degree in Northern Ireland since it was offered in 2008. Additionally, The Open University does not record the number of graduates who continue to gain accreditation and practice as a counsellor.
