Mr McIlveen has asked:

To ask the Minister for Employment and Learning how many counselling courses are offered by (i) further education colleges; and (ii) higher education institutes.

ANSWER

As the Department does not hold the information requested, my officials contacted Queen's University, the University of Ulster and the Open University. The universities currently offer a total of 8 courses.

Regarding further education, my officials have contacted colleges to confirm their counselling provision at all levels. I can confirm that in the current academic year there are 1,589 enrolments on Professional and Technical courses that include counselling. There are currently 31 courses across all campuses, with provision ranging from level 2 to level 7. Level 4 and above is deemed equivalent to Higher Education.



Information provided by the universities and details of the courses held across the further education campuses are attached at Annex A.

The University of Ulster Counselling Courses

Certificate in Counselling Studies (Part-time)

Foundation Degree in Counselling (FdSc Counselling)

The Certificate and FdSc Degree is offered in collaboration with key counselling staff in all the Northern Ireland Regional Colleges.

Undergraduate:

BSc Communication and Counselling – Minor pathway in communication degree comprises six modules.

BSc professional Development in Counselling – 'top up' for Foundation degree students comprises 6 modules

Postgraduate:

MSc Counselling and Therapeutic Communication full and part time

Queen's University Belfast Counselling Courses

Queen's University does not currently offer any counselling courses to new entrants. A Master's in Counselling Practice is currently taught but the last intake to this course was in September 2011 and there will be no further intakes.

Counselling courses offered by The Open University

Foundation Degree in Counselling (240 credits)

Diploma of Higher Education in Counselling (240 credits) – mainly used in Scotland

The Open University's counselling provision is contained within a 240-credit Foundation Degree in Counselling which has been developed in partnership with the Counselling and Psychotherapy Central Awarding Body (CPCAB).

This collaborative scheme is made up of 150 CPCAB credits + 90 OU credits. The programme of study for this foundation degree is also offered as the Diploma of Higher Education in Counselling (W09). The diploma of higher education might be of particular interest to those living and working in Scotland.

Details of study

As a precursor, students normally have to study either: CPCAB's level 2 Cert Counselling skills plus D171 (the OU 15-credit Introduction to Counselling module) or CPCAB's level 2 Cert Counselling skills plus CPCAB's Level 3 Cert Counselling Studies.

Students must then take the following CPCAB modules which provide 150 credits towards this foundation degree and are delivered by a network of FE and private training providers:

- CPCAB Level 4 Diploma in Therapeutic Counselling (collaborative course code CCPP120) (120 points) and CPCAB Level 5 Diploma in Psychotherapeutic Counselling (30 points).
- Or CPCAB Level 5 Certificate in Cognitive Behavioural Therapeutic Skills and Theory (30 points) and 30 credits from the following compulsory OU modules:

Counselling: exploring fear and sadness (D240)

And 60 credits from the following optional OU modules:

Challenging ideas in mental health (K272)

Child development (ED209)

Death and dying (K260)

Diverse perspectives on mental health (K225)

Exploring psychology (DSE212)

The science of the mind: investigating mental health (SDK228)
