In his response to AQO 7965/11-15 regarding sleep clinics, my predecessor undertook to write to you to provide further detail on this service including the link to Edinburgh and the 555 patients waiting for a diagnostic sleep study.

The Health and Social Care Board has advised that the arrangement with Edinburgh did not proceed due to staffing difficulties within that service. As a result, Belfast Health and Social Care (HSC) Trust reviewed the position and secured a locum Respiratory Clinical Physiologist to carry out the testing and reporting of limited polysomnography.

A breakdown of waiting times by HSC Trust at February 2015 is shown in the following table:

Patients are waiting for a range of tests, including overnight oximetry and limited sleep studies that reflect the differing levels of complexity and stages of diagnosis that may be required along the patient pathway. Work is underway to develop



information systems that will capture the whole patient journey across the obstructive sleep apnoea pathway.
