








## Research methodology



#### Surveys

245 participants, aged
18 years and over
518 participants, aged
55 and over
74 carers
82 healthcare
professionals.



#### Workshops

Four workshops with 55+ who were given activity monitors (2016-2017)

Five knowledge exchange workshops (2017-18).



#### **Interviews**

10 users 55+

10 carers

**12** healthcare professionals

5 manufacturers

2 local charities.
