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Number of Beef cattle within Northern Ireland

1 Statistics

According to data derived from the Department of Agriculture and Rural Development's agricultural census, there were a **total of 1,604,356 cattle within Northern Ireland in June 2010**¹.

As illustrated within Figure one, **257,648 (16%) of these cattle were beef cows** and 281,043 (18%) were dairy cows. Of the remaining cattle, 61,920(4%) were dairy cows in calf, **38,410(2%) were beef heifers in calf** and 18,389(1%) were breeding bulls.

The 2010 Agricultural Census report covers data running from 1981 to 2010 and Figure two contains the data for 1981. Looking at this data many of the cattle breakdown proportions in percentage terms are similar with 17% of total cattle being dairy cows and 16% being beef cows.




Figure 1: Breakdown of cattle population - June 2010²




Figure 2: Breakdown of cattle population - June 1981

When comparing the 1981 and 2010 data there has been an overall increase of 3.87% in the total cattle population, rising from 1,544,553 to 1,604,356. Table one below sets out the data relating to dairy and beef cow numbers in 1981 and 2010 as well as highlighting the percentage change in the population over these 2 years.

According to the data and in pure numerical terms the number of Beef cows in June 2010 was 11.41% higher than it was in June 1981 and the number of Beef heifers in calf was 45.67% higher.




Figure 3: Total number of Beef cows 1960-2011³

The impression given by this data that the beef cattle population has grown between 1981 and 2010 is however simplistic, as figure 3 illustrates the **beef cattle population** within Northern Ireland has varied considerably between 1960 and 2010.

Whilst the data included in Figure three is derived from DARD's agricultural census archive which has data from 1847, the disaggregation of cattle into dairy and beef categories only began to be used in 1960. The number of Beef cows within Northern Ireland peaked in 1998 when there were a total of 344,704 individual cows, whilst the lowest recorded figure equated to the 68,000 cows in 1960.

In terms of trends the number of Beef cows here grew markedly between 1960 and 1974 before declining and remaining relatively stable during the 1980's. The early 1990's bore witness to a rise in the population, but the period from the peak of

1998 has been marked by a steady decline in the numbers. The data for 2010 and 2011 reveals a growth in the number of Beef Cows for the first time since 2004 (see Appendix 1).
