Topical Digest Homelessness in Northern Ireland

6 December 2022

(Updated: 8 December 2023)

This Topical Digest covers the issue of homelessness in Northern Ireland. Homelessness is a complex issue that requires a cross-departmental, multi-agency response. The full extent of the longer-term impact of the pandemic on homelessness in Northern Ireland remains to be seen. However, the Housing Executive expects that these impacts will be significant and long-lasting. This digest brings together a snapshot of some of the most recent publications and articles on homelessness with a particular focus on Northern Ireland.

1 Strategies, action plans and programmes

- Ending Homelessness Together: Homelessness Strategy 2022–27 Housing Executive, March 2022. This new five-year homelessness strategy has three central objectives focusing on the prioritisation of homelessness prevention; addressing homelessness by providing settled, appropriate accommodation and support; and assisting those transitioning from homelessness into settled accommodation. The Strategy is accompanied by a <u>Year One Action Plan</u>. It builds upon the work of the previous <u>five-year</u> strategy (2017–2022) and Interdepartmental Homelessness Action Plans.
- Chronic Homelessness Action Plan (2019–22) Housing Executive, January 2020. This plan sets out how the Housing Executive intends to address gaps in service provision. It has seven objectives, including designing criteria for measuring chronic homelessness and developing mechanisms across different bodies for early identification of those at risk.
- Strategic Action Plan for Temporary Accommodation 2022–2027 Housing Executive, November 2022. The strategy explores the different types of temporary accommodation, provides data on the use of temporary accommodation, and examines projected need. It sets out four strategic ambitions including minimising the need for temporary accommodation in Northern Ireland.
