We wish to express our opposition to the Private Members Bill at Stormont to enable the three main sporting bodies in NI to apply for their own full licences to sell alcohol at their stadia. We would be amazed if MLAs supported such a Bill.

As residents of Ravenhill Park we know at first hand that many young people already go to games heavily inebriated and return in an even more intoxicated state, often causing problems for local residents (for example, we have often had pint glasses left outside our house, or thrown into our garden following games).

As we already know, alcohol consumption is a growing problem in our society and in our view MLAs should be taking steps to reduce this rather than to encourage it. Indeed, we fail to understand why sporting arenas should be permitted to sell alcohol at all. Rather than supporting, promoting and indeed sanctioning a link between sport and alcohol consumption, MLAs should be seeking to weaken such a connection. The passing of this Bill would send a very misleading message to our young people in relation to alcohol consumption and sport.

We would therefore urge MLAs not to support this Bill.
