As a School we have contributed to the consultation on school uniforms. The Board of Governors have asked me to submit our previous response, to the consultation, to the education committee see attached).

The School express their opposition to Clauses 3 and 4 of the proposed Bill, namely;

Clause 3 – a proposed restriction on the required number of general uniform items, or of individual branded items; and

Clause 4 – a proposed cap on the cost of uniform required, either for any specific items or for the total uniform.

Both these clauses are apparently subject to a commencement order, which, in effect, delays their implementation after the remainder of the new Uniform Bill has been legally approved.

Additional Information:

As a school, Strathearn currently adheres closely to DE guidance on school uniforms and does not agree that such guidelines should become mandatory thus causing additional administration and bureaucracy that schools can ill afford. Following recent consultation with pupils, staff and parents this year, overwhelming support was expressed for the current style, design and colour of the present uniform. Any future significant change to a uniform would take at least two to three years to implement to allow suppliers to run down old stock but also to allow parents to re-use current uniform. During times of extreme financial pressure, schools do not have the resources of staffing, including time, to continually monitor the cost of uniform against the theoretical cost cap. Cost caps rarely work in practice to artificially manipulate the market and therefor it is no surprise that no other jurisdiction across the UK or Ireland has attempted to implement one. In seeking schools to have a uniform that includes items that can be purchased from supermarkets only favours the large chains and does very little to support our own local suppliers whose selling window is limited to a short period few weeks in the year. Our solution would be to increase the uniform grant by a significant amount (minimum 50% or more) and annually thereafter by the rate of inflation - the extra cost being funded by internal DE/EA savings and not diverted away from front line school services.
