3. Departmental briefing on Statutory Rules from the Food and Farming Group

The following departmental officials joined the meeting at 10.12 a.m.

The officials briefed the Committee and this was followed by a question and answer session.

4. SR 2018/18: the Areas of Natural Constraint Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2018

The Committee considered The Areas of Natural Constraint Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2018 which allows the Department to pay Areas of Natural Constraint allowances to eligible claimants, define conditions such as eligibility, exclusions, timing of notifications, interest calculations, debt arrangements etc.

Agreed:

The Committee considered SR 2018/18: The Areas of Natural Constraint Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2018 and subject to the Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no objection to the Rule.

SR 2018/122: The Common Agricultural Policy Basic Payment and Support Schemes (Revocation) Regulations (NI) 2018

The Committee considered The Common Agricultural Policy Basic Payment and Support Schemes (Revocation) Regulations (NI) 2018 which revokes Regulation 11 of the Common Agricultural Basic Payment and Support Schemes Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015 (Active Farmers).

Agreed:

The Committee considered SR 2018/18: The Areas of Natural Constraint Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2018 and subject to the Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no objection to the Rule.

SR 2018/191: The Beef and Veal Labelling (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2018

The Committee considered The Beef and Veal Labelling (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2018 that will provide enforcement powers for EU legislation dealing with mandatory and voluntary labelling of beef and veal. The voluntary labelling requirements were removed from the EU Regulations in 2014 and now fall under the general labelling principles of the Provision of Food information to Consumers Regulations, which is now the responsibility of the Food Standards Agency. The amendment will reflect this change and remove the enforcement provisions.

Agreed:

The Committee considered SR 2018/191: The Beef and Veal Labelling (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2018 and subject to the Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no objection to the Rule.

7. SR 2018/216: The Carcase Classification and Price Reporting Regulations (NI) 2018

The Committee considered The Carcase Classification and Price Reporting Regulations (NI) 2018, which is required to implement EU Regulation 1308/2016 regarding the Union scales for the classification of beef, pig and sheep carcases and the reporting of marketing prices. DAERA inspectors in meat plants will also require legislative powers to enter the premises and to implement controls and these need to be made before the UK leaves the EU and references to out of date EU legislation will be corrected.

The Committee considered SR 2018/216: The Carcase Classification and Price Reporting Regulations (NI) 2018 and subject to the Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no objection to the Rule.

8. SR 2019/11: The Agriculture (Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations (NI) 2019

The Committee considered The Agriculture (Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations (NI) 2019, which updates references that are required before the UK leaves the EU before the power to do so under Section 2(2) of the European Communities 1972 (ECA) are revoked by the EU (Withdrawal) Act 2018 on EU Exit Day.

Agreed:

The Committee considered SR 2019/11: The Agriculture (Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations (NI) 2019 and subject to the Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no objection to the Rule.

SR 2019/16: The Residues (Charges and Examination) (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2019

The Committee considered The Residues (Charges and Examination) (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2019 which makes minor amendments to update EU references before the power to do so under Section 2(2) of the European Communities 1972 (ECA) are revoked by the EU (Withdrawal) Act 2018 on EU Exit Day.

Agreed:

The Committee considered SR 2019/16: The Residues (Charges and Examination) (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2019 and subject to the Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no objection to the Rule.

10. SR 2019/66: The Marketing of Bananas Regulations (NI) 2019

The Committee considered The Marketing of Bananas Regulations (NI) 2019 which provide DAERA with the powers to enforce EU Regulation 1333/2011, which lays down marketing standards for bananas and rules on the verification of compliance with those marketing standards before exit from the EU, which at the time set was 29 March 2019, when the power to do would be repealed by the European Union (Withdrawal Act) 2018.

Agreed:

The Committee considered SR 2019/66: The Marketing of Bananas Regulations (NI) 2019 and subject to the Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no objection to the Rule.

11. SR 2019/67: The Equine Identification Regulations (NI) 2019

The Committee considered The Equine Identification Regulations (NI) 2019, which will be the introduction of a time limit for submitting an application for a horse passport and the requirements for updating passport information with associated penalties.

Agreed:

The Committee considered SR 2019/67: The Equine Identification Regulations (NI) 2019 and subject to the

Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no objection to the Rule.

12. SR 2019/85: The Common Agricultural Policy (Review of Decisions) (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2019

The Committee considered The Common Agricultural Policy (Review of Decisions) (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2019 which will amend The Common Agricultural Policy (Review of Decisions) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015 (SR 2015/318).

The Committee considered SR 2019/85: The Common Agricultural Policy (Review of Decisions) (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2019 and subject to the Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no objection to the Rule.

The Committee considered The Eggs and Chicks and Poultrymeat (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2019 which will update minor amendments to out-of-date EU references before the power to do so under Section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972 are revoked by the EU (Withdrawal) Act 2018.

Agreed:

The Committee considered SR 2019/210: The Eggs and Chicks and Poultrymeat (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2019 and subject to the Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no objection to the Rule.

15. SR 2019/82: The Animal Health and Welfare (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2019

The Committee considered The Animal Health and Welfare (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2019 that amends out-of-date EU and domestic legislation as it has been revoked, replaced or amended. This will accurately reflect the most updated position prior to the conversion into UK law following the EU (Withdrawal) Act 2018.

Agreed:

The Committee considered SR 2019/82: The Animal Health and Welfare (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2019 and subject to the Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no objection to the Rule.

16. SR 2019/197: The Animal Health and Welfare (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations (NI) 2019

The Committee considered The Animal Health and Welfare (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations (NI) 2019 which will make minor miscellaneous amendments to Northern Ireland legislation to deal with out-of-date EU references in order to accurately reflect the correct version of EU law before conversion into UK law to allow it to function effectively.

Agreed:

The Committee considered SR 2019/197: The Animal Health and Welfare (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations (NI) 2019 and subject to the Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no objection to the Rule.

17. SR 2018/204: The Zootechnical Standards Regulations (NI) 2018

The Committee considered The Zootechnical Standards Regulations (NI) 2018, which will make provision to implement Regulation (EU) 2016/1012 of the European Parliament and of the Council in Northern Ireland to cover promotion and production of livestock with particular genetic characteristics by setting standards for the breeding of these animals. It also imposes a requirement for controls and checks on the activities of recognised breed

societies in the UK (including Northern Ireland) to ensure consistent application of the rules.

Agreed: The Committee considered SR 2018/204: The Zootechnical

Standards Regulations (NI) 2018 and subject to the Examiner

of Statutory Rule report had no objection to the Rule.

18. SR 2018/213: The Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathies Regulations (NI) 2018

The Committee considered The Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathies Regulations (NI) 2018, which replaces and updates the previous domestic legislation, The Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathies Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2010 to clarify policy, operational and technical changes.

Agreed: The Committee considered SR 2018/213: The Transmissible

Spongiform Encephalopathies Regulations (NI) 2018 and subject to the Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no

objection to the Rule.

19. SR 2019/227: The Official Controls (Animals, Feeds and Food) Regulations (NI) 2019

The Committee considered The Official Controls (Animals, Feeds and Food) Regulations (NI) 2019, which supports the implementation of the animal health and welfare aspects of the Official Controls Regulations and replaces the Official Controls (Animals, Feeds and Food) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2007.

Agreed: The Committee considered SR 2019/227: The Official

Controls (Animals, Feeds and Food) Regulations (NI) 2019 and subject to the Examiner of Statutory Rules report had no

objection to the Rule.

23. SR 2017/086: The Environmental Impact Assessment (Forestry) (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2017

The Committee The Environmental Impact Assessment (Forestry) (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2017 which amends the existing implementation of Directive 2011/92/EU on the assessment of the effects of certain public and private projects on the environment ("EIA Directive").

It brings into effect Directive 2014/52/EU amending Directive 2011/92/EU ("2014 Directive"), which amends the EIA Directive.

Agreed:

The Committee agreed to defer consideration of SR 2017/086: The Environmental Impact Assessment (Forestry) (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2017 until the meeting on 30 January 2020.

24. SR 2017/119: The Marketing of Fruit Plant and Propagating Material Regulations (NI) 2017

The Committee considered the Marketing of Fruit Plant and Propagating Material Regulations (NI) 2017, which will implement Council Directive 2008/90 /EC on the marketing of fruit plant propagating material, and fruit plants intended for fruit production. It also implements the Commission Implementing Directive 2014/96/EU, 2014/97/EU and 2014/98/EU.

Agreed:

The Committee agreed to defer consideration of SR 2017/119: The Marketing of Fruit Plant and Propagating Material Regulations (NI) 2017 until the meeting on 30 January 2020.

25. SR 2018/183: The Marketing of Ornamental Plant Propagating Material (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2018

The Committee considered The Marketing of Ornamental Plant Propagating Material (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2018 which amends the Marketing of Ornamental Plant Propagating Material Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1999 (S.R. 1999 No. 502) which implements Council Directive 1998/56/EC and sets out the marketing requirements for ornamental plant propagating material. It implements Commission Implementing Directive (EU) 2018/484 which sets out additional marketing requirements for certain species of Palmae (palms, including trees) to prevent infestation of the harmful organism Rhychophorus ferrugineus (Olivier), also known as red palm weevil.

The Committee agreed to defer consideration of SR 2018/183: The Marketing of Ornamental Plant Propagating Material (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2018 until the meeting on 30 January 2020.

26. SR 2018/184: The Plant Health Order (NI) 2018

The Committee considered The Plant Health Order (NI) 2018 which consolidates with amendments the Plant Health Order (Northern Ireland) 2006 (S.R. 2006 No. 82) which contains measures to prevent the introduction and spread of harmful plant pests and diseases and the Plant Health (Phytophthora ramorum) Order (Northern Ireland) 2005 (S.R. 2005 No. 23) which contains measures to prevent the introduction and spread of Phytophthora ramorum and various amendments to those Orders.

Agreed:

The Committee agreed to defer consideration of SR 2018/184: The Plant Health Order (NI) 2018 until the meeting on 30 January 2020.

27. SR 2019/41: The Plant Health and Seeds (Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations (NI) 2019

The Committee considered The Plant Health and Seeds (Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations (NI) 2019, which make necessary amendments in order to update out of date legislative references within domestic legislation. The amendments will be made under existing powers in the European Communities Act 1972 prior to EU exit day. The amendments are minor and technical and do not involve implementing any new policy.

The Committee agreed to defer consideration of SR 2019/41: The Plant Health and Seeds (Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations (NI) 2019 until the meeting on 30 January 2020.

28. SR 2019/49: The Plant Health (Amendment) Order (NI) 2019

The Committee considered The Plant Health (Amendment) Order (NI) 2019 which amends the Plant Health Order (Northern Ireland) 2018 (S.R. 2018 No. 184) ("the principal Order") which contains measures to prevent the introduction and spread of harmful plant pests and diseases. It extends current measures to protect against the introduction of Xylella fastidiosa from the EU following findings on olive trees in Belgium, implements the specific control measures in Commission Implementing Decisions (EU) 2018/1503 and (EU) 2018/1511, removes provisions relating to Commission Implementing Decisions 2014/237/EU and (EU) 2015/1849 which are no longer in force and updates the principal Order to clarify all the material that is subject to import checks

Agreed:

The Committee agreed to defer consideration of SR 2019/49: The Plant Health (Amendment) Order (NI) 2019 until the meeting on 30 January 2020.

29. SR 2019/50: The Forest Reproductive Material (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2019

The Committee considered The Forest Reproductive Material (Amendment) Regulations (NI) 2019 which amends The Forest Reproductive Material Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2002 (S.R. 2002 No. 404) which make provisions for the approval of basic material for use in the production of forest reproductive material which may be marketed in Northern Ireland.

The Committee considered The Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees) Regulations (NI) 2019 which revoke and replace the Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005 and the Plant Health (Import Inspection Fees) (Wood and Bark) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005. Under Directive 2000/29/EC member States are required to charge fees to cover the costs of documentary, identity and plant health checks of certain imports of plants, plant products and other objects from third countries. The Directive contains a procedure for setting reduced rates of inspection for imports of plants, plant products and for charging fees at a proportionally reduced rate.

Under Directive 2000/29/EC member States are required to charge fees to cover the costs of documentary, identity and plant health checks of certain imports of plants, plant products and other objects from third countries. The Directive contains a procedure for setting reduced rates of inspection for imports of plants, plant products and for charging fees at a proportionally reduced rate.
