2. Ministerial Briefing on proposals for NI Climate Change Legislation and Establishment of an Independent Environmental Protection Agency.

3. Chairperson's Business

4. Minutes

5. Matters arising

The Committee noted a response from the Department to issues raised by a taxi driver regarding taxi legislation.

Agreed: The Committee agreed to forward the response to the individual who raised this matter with it.

The Committee noted a response from the Department on draft Policy Guidance on the Identification and Designation of Quiet Areas.

Agreed: The Committee agreed to copy the response to the Belfast Airport Watch group who had written to it on this matter.

Agreed: The Committee agreed a draft a response to the Council explaining the rationale for the timescale.

The Committee noted a response from Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon Borough Council regarding Japanese Knotweed.

The Committee noted correspondence about the evidence given by officials to the Committee on Japanese knotweed.

Agreed: The Committee agreed to forward the correspondence to the Department for a response to the issues raised in it.

Agreed: The Committee agreed to write to the correspondent to advise of the action that Committee has taken and that Japanese knotweed will be included in the Committee's legacy report.

7. SL1 - The Groundwater (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2016

Agreed: The Committee agreed that it was content for the Department to proceed with the proposed statutory rule.

8. The Draft Local Government (Community Planning Partners) Order (Northern Ireland) 2016

Agreed: The Committee agreed to write to the Department to clarify that the section in the Explanatory Memorandum is incorrect, as the Committee did not agree the Order on 28th January; and that reservations of the Committee were forwarded to the Department at that time.

Mrs Pam Cameron and Mr Alastair Patterson expressed reservations that CCMS is named as a statutory partner in the Order, as it is represented on the Board of the Education Authority which is also a statutory partner.

The Committee expressed reservations that government departments did not wish to be named as statutory partners in the Order. However, while these reservations were noted, the Committee proceeded to agree the Statutory Rule:
