## RSUA's role

Thank you for the opportunity to respond to this consultation on the Water, Sustainable Drainage and Flood Management Bill.

## The Bill

RSUA welcomes the introduction of this legislation as an intended means of reducing pollution in watercourses, enhancing resilience to extreme weather events and promoting more sustainable, environmentally responsible approaches to the management of water resources.

We also recognise that this is enabling legislation and, as such, anticipate that the Department for Infrastructure (DfI) will set out more comprehensive proposals connected to the Bill's provisions in due course.

We look forward to responding to these proposals, beginning later this month with Dfl's ongoing consultation on proposals for sustainable drainage systems (SuDS) in new housing developments. In this context, we intend to provide fuller feedback on aspects of policy facilitated by this legislation, including our views on the implementation of mandatory SuDS, the oversight of their installation and funding arrangements.
