**The Police Act 1997 (Criminal Records) (Amendment No. 2)
Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2026**

Made - - - - *16th November 2026*

Coming into operation- - *14th December 2026*

The Department of Justice makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 113B(2)(b), 113BB(1), 125(1) and (5) of the Police Act 1997(a) as modified by section 126A(b) of that Act.

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police Act 1997 (Criminal Records) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2026 and shall come into operation on 14th December 2026.

Amendment of the Police Act 1997 (Criminal Records) (Disclosure) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2008

2.—(1) The Police Act 1997 (Criminal Records) (Disclosure) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2008(c) are amended as follows.

(2) After regulation 9(1)(s) insert—

“(t) considering the applicant’s suitability to assess children and vulnerable adults as a registered health care professional, within the meaning of “health care professional” in Article 2(2) of the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Order 1998, where the applicant is employed or engaged by-

- (i) the Department for Communities; or
- (ii) contractors or sub-contractors, who are carrying out activities for the Department for Communities”.

(3) In regulation 9A, after “(p)” omit “or (q)” and insert “, (q) or (t).”.

(4) In regulation 9B, after “(r)” omit “or (s)” and insert “, (s) or (t).”.

Section 125(1) of the 1997 Act (as modified by section 126A(2)) provides that anything authorised or required by any provision of Part 5 of the 1997 Act to be prescribed shall be prescribed by regulations made by the Department of Justice in Northern Ireland.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Police Act 1997 (Criminal Records) (Disclosure) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2008 (“the 2008 Regulations”) to make provision for enhanced criminal record checks with suitability information in relation to individuals who are seeking to assess children and vulnerable adults as registered Health Care Professionals employed or engaged by the Department for Communities, or by its contractors or sub-contractors, who are carrying out activities for the Department for Communities.

The 2008 Regulations make detailed provision in relation to applications for criminal conviction certificates, criminal record certificates and enhanced criminal record certificates under Part 5 of the Police Act 1997 (“the 1997 Act”). Regulation 9 of the 2008 Regulations prescribes the purposes for which an enhanced criminal record certificate may be required. Regulation 9A prescribes the cases in which an enhanced criminal record certificate must also include suitability information relating to children. Regulation 9B prescribes the cases in which an enhanced criminal record certificate must also include suitability information relating to adults.

Regulation 2(2) of these Regulations amends regulation 9 of the 2008 Regulations, creating a new prescribed purpose for which an enhanced criminal record certificate may be required. The effect of the amendment is to enable enhanced criminal record checks to be carried out in relation to individuals who are seeking to assess children and vulnerable adults as registered Health Care Professionals employed or engaged by the Department for Communities, or by its contractors or sub-contractors, who are carrying out activities for the Department for Communities.

Regulations 2(3) amends regulation 9A of the 2008 Regulations, to make provision for checks on suitability information (barred list information) in respect of children, for the new prescribed purpose set out in regulation 2(2).

Regulation 2(4) amends regulation 9B of the 2008 Regulations, to make provision for checks on suitability information (barred list information) in respect of vulnerable adults, for the new prescribed purpose set out in regulation 2(2).
