We do not hold this information.

2. The number of plants categorised as high-risk both before and after the trading arrangements set out in the EU-UK Withdrawal Agreement and NI Protocol (and subsequently the Windsor Framework) entered into operation.

We obtained the following response from Defra.

There are 35 genera of plants for planting that are classified as High-Risk plants by the EU. Since the WF entered into operation we have obtained lifting of export prohibitions for species in 9 genera of these plants (multiple species within some genera were allowed for export to the EU/NI).

Please see 'Movement of high-risk and prohibited plants' section of Export plants and plant products from Great Britain and Northern Ireland - GOV.UK for prohibited/allowed genera lists.
