2. Briefing by Dermot Nesbitt on the 'Particular Circumstances' of Northern Ireland

Dermot Nesbitt, former Junior Minister in the Office of the First Minister and deputy First Minister and former Minister of the Environment joined the meeting at 2.03 p.m.

His briefing summarised his experience as a member of The Bill of Rights Forum, a negotiator for the UUP during the multi-party talks leading up to the Belfast Agreement and a member of the Standing Advisory Commission on Human Rights.

He outlined the benefits of drawing on international law and presented the Framework Convention for the Protection of National Minorities as a solution.

The oral evidence was followed by a question and answer session.

The Chairperson thanked Dermot for his attendance.

3. Briefing by Mark Durkan on the 'Particular Circumstances' of Northern Ireland

Mark Durkan, former deputy First Minister joined the meeting via StarLeaf at 3.13 p.m.

His briefing reflected on his experience as a negotiator for the SDLP during the multiparty talks leading to the Belfast Agreement and what the term 'particular circumstances' meant. He also recounted what the Agreement intended or offered in terms of a Bill of Rights for Northern Ireland. He explained that Westminster was tasked with legislating for such a Bill as a guarantee as it would not require all-party agreement. He raised a number of concerns in the current context including the Internal Market Bill and Brexit.

The oral evidence was followed by a question and answer session.

Mark Durkan MLA left the meeting at 3.39 p.m.

The Chairperson thanked Mark for his evidence.
