2. Briefing by Professor Colm O'Cinneide on Brexit and its wider implications for human rights in Northern Ireland

Colm O'Cinneide, Professor of Constitutional and Human Rights Law at University College London, joined the meeting via StarLeaf at 2.03 p.m.

His briefing outlined the legal consequences of Brexit for a number of areas of human rights protection including: equality, non-discrimination and employment rights. It also considered how the circumstances of Northern Ireland were 'particular', noting that most of the equality law in Northern Ireland is in the form of regulations rather than comprehensive legislation which makes it uniquely easy to amend.
