### **2. Covid-19 and Schools Restart – Minister for Education– Oral Evidence Session**

- information on the Department's access to covid-19 testing capacity for schools including the number of tests that can be processed and the likely turnaround time for those tests;
- information on the additional Restart costs for schools including catering, well-being support and educational catch-up as well as an update on the provision and timing of additional resources for schools including through the Engage programme;
- sight of the CCEA curriculum guidance to schools for 2021;
- information on the need for risk assessments for medically vulnerable children and staff including the number of assessments likely to be required and the progress to-date in completing them;
- sight of the additional Restart guidance to be provided to Special Schools including in respect of transport arrangements; and
- clarification as to whether pupil well-being guidance will be issued to schools and whether DE has sought guidance on this matter, including the identification of trauma in returning pupils, from Stranmillis University College.

*Agreed:* The Committee agreed to amend the agenda for its meeting on 21 August 2020 so as to include a briefing on Restart from the teaching unions.

The Committee considered issues relating to its forward work programme.
