The Chairperson thanked the Minister and officials for the briefing.

Agreed: The Committee agreed to write to the Minister of Education expressing concerns that the lack of confidence in the contact tracing system needs to be addressed and seeking:

- Information on the Department's bid for funding to improve ventilation in schools;
- Sight of contingency plans for schools in the event of increased cases of Covid-19.

Agreed: The Committee agreed to write to the Chief Medical Officer expressing concerns that the lack of confidence in the contact tracing system needs to be addressed and asking that he engage directly with schools and school leaders. The Committee also agreed to ask for:

- Data for close-contact positivity for the third term and for the most recent period including delta-wave data; and
- A clear definition of close contact.

- An update on the status of and actions against recommendations in the Committee's Report on the Inquiry into Shared and Integrated Education of July 2015;
- An update on the Strategic Review of Integrated Education.
