7. Legislative Consent Motion – Domestic Abuse Bill

The Committee considered information provided by the Department of Justice on a proposal for a Legislative Consent Motion to extend provisions of the Domestic Abuse Bill relating to extending the power of the courts in Northern Ireland to try in the home jurisdiction certain sexual and violent offences which have been committed abroad by way of a Legislative Consent Motion.

The Committee noted that the Department of Justice had confirmed that the LCM would have no impact on the Domestic Abuse and Family Proceedings Bill.

Agreed: The Committee agreed that it was content with the Department of

Justice's proposal to extend the provisions of the Domestic Abuse Bill relating to extending the power of the courts in Northern Ireland to try in the home jurisdiction certain sexual and violent offences which have

been committed abroad by way of a Legislative Consent Motion.

8. The Northern Ireland Criminal Injuries Compensation (Amendment 2020) Scheme (2009)

The Committee considered The Northern Ireland Criminal Injuries Compensation (Amendment 2020) Scheme (2009) which would allow victims of a crime between 1 March 1969 and 30 June 1988 living as a member of the same household as their assailant to apply for Criminal Injuries Compensation.

Agreed: The Committee considered the draft Northern Ireland Criminal Injuries

Compensation (Amendment 2020) Scheme (2009) and recommended

that it be approved by the Assembly.

9. Committee Forward Work Programme

The Committee considered a draft Forward Work Programme for June 2020 and noted that arrangements had been finalised for the oral evidence sessions with Women's Aid Federation and the Men's Advisory Project on the Domestic Abuse and Family Proceedings Bill for the meeting on 11 June 2020.

The Committee considered further information provided by the Minister of Justice on a range of work items that the Department wished to progress before summer recess and the rationale for considering them urgent or essential.

Agreed: The Committee agreed to schedule an additional Committee meeting at

papers.

Agreed: Further consideration will be given on a weekly basis to the need for

additional meetings.

Agreed: Committee meetings on Thursdays during June would commence at

10.30 a.m.

Agreed: The Committee agreed to consider a written briefing paper from the

Department on the Outcome of the Consultation on the Live Links Provision in the Justice (Miscellaneous Provisions) Bill and Proposed Next Steps. An oral evidence session would then be scheduled if

considered necessary.
