

## **PARKING PLACES – DISABLED PERSONS’ VEHICLES**

The Department for Infrastructure (DfI) proposes to make an Order entitled The Parking Places (Disabled Persons’ Vehicles) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2026.

The Order will **create** parking places with unlimited waiting in **Belfast**: Archdale Park in a lay-by in front of No. 24, Ballysillan Drive in front of No. 27, Carncaver Road in front of No. 48, Cavendish Street in front of No. 79, Cliftonville Road in a lay-by in front of No. 217 and in a lay-by in front of No. 246, Cuba Walk in a parking area adjacent to No. 5 Scotch Row, Essex Grove to the side of No. 111 Ormeau Road, Glenbank Place in front of No. 52, Lower Windsor Avenue in front of No. 35, Mount Merrion Avenue in a parking area to the side of No. 150, Mount Prospect Park in front of No. 33, Nevis Avenue in front of No. 35, Ponsonby Avenue in front of No. 49, Sydenham Drive in front of No. 13, Wheatfield Crescent in front of Nos. 21 and 79 (2 bays); **Coleraine**: Brook Street in a parking area to the rear of No. 35; **Cookstown**: Fairhill Road in front of No. 34 (Mid Ulster Victim Empowerment Project) (2 bays); **Derry/Londonderry**: Bards Hill in a parking area in front of No. 29, Elaghmore Park in front of No. 60, Ernest Street in front of No. 3, Grainan Drive in front of No. 77, Hollymount Park in a parking area to the rear of No. 57 and Lone Moor Road in a lay-by in front of 7 Noreen Walk; **Irvinestown**: Reihill Park in a lay-by in front of No. 57; and **Newry**: Cathedral View in a parking area in front of No. 7.

The Order will **amend** the description of parking places with unlimited waiting in **Derry/Londonderry**: Elaghmore Park to the rear of No. 53 and to the front of No. 59 (2 bays); and **Irvinestown**: Hudson Heights in a parking area in front of Nos. 30/32.

### **All parking places are for the use of disabled persons’ vehicles only.**

The Order will also **remove** parking places with unlimited waiting in **Belfast**: Castlereagh Place in front of No. 10 and Donegall Avenue in front of No 173; **Cookstown**: Fairhill Road in front of No. 34 (Mid Ulster Victim Empowerment Project); and **Derry/Londonderry**: Lawrence Hill in front of No. 16 and Rosemount Gardens in a lay-by to the side of No. 50.
