**The Motor Vehicles (Specified Restrictions) (Amendment)
Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2026**

Made - - - - 2026

Coming into operation - 1st October 2026

The Department for Infrastructure^(a) makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by Articles 19AB(3), (5) and (11), 214(1) and 218(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981^(b) and now vested in it^(c).

In accordance with Article 19AC(11) of that Order, a draft of these Regulations was laid before, and approved by a resolution of, the Assembly.

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Motor Vehicles (Specified Restrictions) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2026 and shall come into operation on 1st October 2026.

Amendment of the Motor Vehicles (Specified Restrictions) Regulations

2.—(1) The Motor Vehicles (Specified Restrictions) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1998^(d) are amended in accordance with paragraphs (2) to (5).

(2) In regulation 2 (restrictions on drivers) for “Article 19A(1) and (3)” substitute “Article 19AB(3)”.

(3) In regulation 3 (distinguishing mark) for “Article 19A(5)(a)” substitute “Article 19AB(5)(a)”.

(4) For regulation 4 (non-application of Article 19A of the 1981 Order) substitute—

(a) Formerly the Department for Regional Development; see section 1(6) and (11) of, and Schedule 1 to, the Departments Act (Northern Ireland) 2016 (2016 c. 5 (N.I.)). Pursuant to section 1(9) of that Act, the Department of the Environment is dissolved

(b) S.I. 1981/154 (N.I. 1); Article 19AB was substituted by section 19(3) of 2016 c.11 (N.I.)

(c) See Article 8(1)(b) of, and Part 2 of Schedule 5 to, the Departments (Transfer of Functions) Order (Northern Ireland) 2016 (S.R. 2016 No. 76)

“Non-application of Article 19AB(5) of the 1981 Order

4.—(1) Article 19AB(5) of the 1981 Order does not apply to any person while driving a motor vehicle the maximum speed of which is restricted by the Motor Vehicles (Speed Limits) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1989(a) to 45 miles per hour or less.

(2) Article 19AB(5)(a) of the 1981 Order does not apply to—

- (a) any member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of His Majesty, while in uniform and driving a motor vehicle which is the property of the Crown;
- (b) any member of the Police Service for Northern Ireland while driving a motor vehicle which is being used for police purposes; or
- (c) the holder of a driving licence granted under the 1981 Order by reason of a test of competence passed by him at a time when he held a licence or permit which, by virtue of an order made under the Motor Vehicles (International Circulation) Act 1952(b), entitled him to drive motor vehicles in Northern Ireland.”.

(5) For the Schedule (diagram of distinguishing mark to be displayed) substitute the Schedule set out in the Schedule to these Regulations.



PART 1


Diagram of distinguishing mark to be displayed during the first 6 months of the new driver period

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations make amendments to the Motor Vehicles (Specified Restrictions) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1998 (“1998 Regulations”) which are required as a consequence of the introduction of Graduated Driver Licensing in Northern Ireland.

They update references in regulations 2 and 3 of the 1998 Regulations to reflect the introduction of revised restrictions for newly qualified drivers of categories A and B vehicles and substitute the distinguishing mark outlined in the Schedule to those Regulations with new post-test R plates which must be displayed by newly qualified drivers.

The Regulations also amend regulation 4 of the 1998 Regulations so the new restrictions and post-test R plates do not apply to any person driving a motor vehicle the maximum speed of which is restricted to 45 miles per hour or less. The reference to Royal Ulster Constabulary in that provision has been amended to Police Service for Northern Ireland.
