1. Apologies

2. Minutes

Agreed: Officials agreed to explore with manufacturers of taximeters whether they can stipulate in their instructions that meters should only be fitted by authorised personnel.

Agreed: The Committee was content for the Department to make the Rule, subject to officials' assurances to consider issues around the fitting of taximeters by authorised personnel; and educating people on the health and safety aspects of fitting taximeters.

The Committee noted correspondence from the Minister advising it of additional amendments to the Road Traffic (Amendment) Bill.

Agreed: The Committee agreed to invite officials to brief it on the proposed additional amendments to the Road Traffic (Amendment) Bill.

The Committee noted a response from the Department regarding the European Commission's referral to the Court of Justice regarding noncompliance of a European Commission Directive at Ballycastle Waste Water Treatment Works.

Agreed: The Committee agreed to write to the Department to ascertain if the Department would be liable for any costs; and to request regular updates on this matter.

The Committee noted correspondence from West Tyrone Against Wind Turbines regarding wind turbine noise.
