In the course of my response to your Topical Question of 1 April (AQT 972/11-15) I agreed to provide Members with details of the number of vacant domestic properties in Northern Ireland.

The table at Annex A gives the number of occupied and vacant domestic dwellings in Northern Ireland at 31 March 2014, broken down by district council.

You also asked what discussions had been held between my Department and others, including DSD, about the potential to use these vacant properties to address housing shortages in Dungannon and other areas.

Land & Property Services continue to work closely with DSD to address the issue. For example, the attached leaflet highlighting empty homes as a wasted resource was issued with all rates bills in April 2014 on behalf of DSD. In addition, my Department introduced the rating of empty homes, not only to assist with wider policy objectives on improving housing affordability and availability, but also to encourage owners to make productive use of property, either by selling or renting it.
