Pat Sheehan MLA has asked:

the Minister of Education whether he discussed education policies, including plans to build an Irish Language school in East Belfast, with the Loyalist Communities Council at their meeting on 24 September 2024.

ANSWER

Mr David Campbell, Chairman of the Loyalist Communities Council, wrote to me in March 2024 requesting a meeting to discuss educational underachievement in loyalist communities. I accepted this invitation, and a meeting was scheduled for July 2024, which was then rearranged for 24 September.

The focus of the meeting was to discuss approaches and programmes to tackle educational underachievement and disadvantage. The meeting lasted around 50 minutes. Before the meeting concluded, the LCC representatives raised concerns about what they perceived as being a lack of community support for an Irish Medium school in East Belfast.

The only action point from the meeting was for officials to share information on the RAISE programme which is intended to take a localitybased approach to raise aspiration and tackle underachievement in areas of disadvantage.

I have placed a copy of the minutes of this meeting in the Assembly library for the attention of members.
