Question: To ask the Minister for Communities whether he will review how local

sporting bodies support fully inclusive sports for disabled people

Actions taken by Sport NI

I have sought the requested information from the Chief Executive, who has advised

me of the following information:

"Sport NI support and fund local sporting bodies such as national governing bodies

and Disability Sport NI (DSNI), through various sport development programmes.

Programme requirements include for sports bodies to develop and implement a

delivery plan for this funding, which will include actions to support fully inclusive sports

for disabled people. Sport NI monitor the implementation of these plans over the

course of programme delivery to ensure that funding is being allocated as agreed

within the delivery plan and the impact this is having.

For example, in 2024/25 DSNI has received Lottery funding of £151,600 for developing

the sport of Boccia and £182,700 for developing Wheelchair Basketball, as well as

exchequer funding of £483,000. Furthermore, Sport NI has also invested £804,652

into disability sport across a range of sports governing bodies through our Sport

Systems Investment in Governing Bodies programme under key themes of retention

and growth, (£469,452) into 17 sports, and medals and more (£335,200) into 8 sports.

Sport NI has also created 'The Disability Engagement & Delivery plan, 2024-2026', to

help influence the sector to actively promote 'Disability in Sport'. The Disability

Engagement and Delivery plan is intended to support the wider sports sector to

understand and recognise the issues for disabled people in sport, as well as

collectively bringing about change.

Through the Disability Engagement & Delivery plan, Sport NI work closely with

external groups and communities, which focuses on programming and activity across

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four key pillars: Leadership, Visibility & Advocacy, Participation & Sporting Foundation. Sport NI are currently creating an EDI focused resource page for the Sport NI website that will include context and reference to this plan. This will also include communications and support to increase visibility of people with a disability in sport and inspire those with a disability to find their sport e.g. Active Living No Limits website.

Sport NI are also members and secretariate of the Active Living No Limits Forum. This group is a partnership of organisations with a remit for the ongoing development of opportunities for increased participation of people with a disability in sport and physical activity to support fully inclusive sports for disabled people. The group seeks to promote its agenda at a variety of forums and disseminate the outcomes, good practice and learning linked to Active Living Strategy and to provide an effective voice for disability inclusion within the sport sector".
