Additional Information:

Sport NI's Sport System Investment in Governing Bodies (SSI-GB) for 2025/26 has a funding strand for retention and growth. **Retention & Growth** includes the ambition of sports to grow participation (not just members) in their sports and increase opportunities through sport, targeting under-represented groups or communities, including women and girls, people with a disability and those in later life.

Under SSI-GB Sport NI are currently aware that Rowing IRL via the get going get rowing programme funded through SSIGB investment delivers SEN sessions. Sport NI are not aware of the cost associated to this is, however, Rowing Ireland currently invest £44,650 for Retention and Growth. £20,350 is to be spent in capital to purchase new row ergs for the programme which aims to increase the number of classes being offered to Special Schools and special needs groups within schools by 25% during 2025/26. There were 300 opportunities for special needs individuals to participate in classes in 2024/25, and Rowing Ireland are targeting 400 opportunities to participate in 2025/26.

Sport NI are aware that other sports are developing disability sport projects for 2025/26 using SSI-GB 2025/26 funding and that these may include SEN projects. However, as these are in the development stage Sport NI does not have detailed information on these initiatives as this time.

Available Funding

Sport NI would also advise that Creating Opportunities investment programme is currently open and Sport NI would welcome applications from members of the Special Educational Needs community.
