Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA) is one of many commercially available interventions for children with autism

The Task Group on Autism concluded that "Interventions should be child-centred rather than method centred, and should address the observed and unique needs of the child." I continue to accept this view and, therefore, do not promote one type of intervention over another.

Although there are **several journals** devoted to the science of behaviour analysis, the two primary journals are the **Journal of the Experimental Analysis of Behavior** and **the Journal of Applied Behavior Analysis**. Psychologists and other government advisers in the UK are not trained to international standards in ABA

The National Institute for Clinical Excellence (NICE), in their response to the consultation for guidelines for the management of children with autism concluded the following:

"In the review of evidence, the Guideline Development Group found no evidence to support ABA, and therefore could not make a recommendation about it." (NICE 2013)

ABA (Applied Behaviour Analysis) is not a 'treatment' for autism, but the scientific discipline from which principles of behaviour are uncovered which can give both children and adults new skills and ways of engaging with others. It's perhaps best known in working with children with autism,
