The approach of the winter months is often a stark reminder of the significant <u>impact</u> fuel poverty has on mental, physical and social well-being. Although it is important to also recognise that fuel poverty is a <u>year-round</u> problem affecting those who, even in warmer weather, struggle with energy bills. <u>Children and young people</u>, <u>older people</u>, <u>people with disabilities</u>, <u>carers</u>, and those living in <u>poor housing conditions</u> are just some of the groups that are particularly vulnerable to the effects of fuel poverty.
